INSPIRATIONAL SPEAKERS AT BAPTISM MATTERS WORKSHOP

Bishop Chris joined others from across the diocese to take part in a Baptism Matters workshop in February

Led by the Revd Canon Dr Sandra Millar, Head of Projects and Development for Archbishop's Council of the Church of England, the event which was held at the Royal Cornwall Showground in Wadebridge, boasted a capacity audience of clergy and lay people all keen to hear more about baptism.

The 'Baptism Matters' project is part of the national Church of England's initiative to make occasional office ministry more effective. Resources and teaching are based around the results of extensive research conducted with families who recently had their children baptised.

During the workshop, those present learned more about the research findings as well as discovering new resources to help support ministry of baptism. There were new baptismal liturgy options discussed and new resources for baptism preparation.

During the morning those present also heard that May 1 is Godparents Sunday, a



chance to celebrate all Godparents.

The Revd Canon Simon Griffiths has been installed as the new Head of Worship at Truro Cathedral.



BISHOP'S LETTER

You take the high road....I have just returned from General Synod in London where we discussed a variety of matters. Two and a half days of business went by very quickly.

It was good to hear from the Archbishop of Canterbury in his presidential address about what happened at the Primates Meeting in January. Much concern had been expressed about whether this would be the end of the Anglican Communion as we know it yet after much prayer and difficult conversation they have agreed to walk together.

Synod also debated various proposals around the Renewal and Reform agenda for the future of the Church of England. Clearly we are facing major issues and pressures upon us. These proposals are a variety of measures that are planned to try and address the decline in church attendance and influence. We agreed to a change in the funding offered by the Church Commissioners and after a rather complicated and tetchy debate we agreed to a new mechanism for funding candidates in training of ordination.

We also had a good debated on welfare sanctions and passed overwhelmingly a motion to encourage the Government to review the system now in place.

In the middle of much else we debated, and again passed by a large majority, a motion to encourage all of us to donate blood if we can and carry organ donation cards.

It is good to see ideas coming through from parishes and deaneries via dioceses to be discussed at General Synod. The process works.

We also had a presentation from the Moderator of the Church of Scotland before we debated a motion to accept a report that gives encouragement to the Church of England and the Church of Scotland to go on working together and see if we can work even more closely together. This caused some difficulty as the Scottish Episcopal Church (SEC), or parts of it, did not feel they had been really consulted as part of this process. In the end we passed an amended motion which encourages us to keep the SEC in the loop going forward.

As I came away from an action packed few days I was encouraged by the notion of walking together and whether it is the high road or the low road. Surely as Christians we should always endeavour to keep walking together even when the pressures for all sorts of reasons are to walk on our own?

MISSION CASE STUDY YOUTH WORK NEEDS EFFORT BUT BRINGS BLESSINGS

Nina, a St Keverne born and bred mother of three, started running a local youth group in 2004. The St Keverne Young People's (SKYP) club has about 40 young people on the register aged between 11 and 16 and runs on the third, fourth and fifth Fridays of the month.

Nina became involved in working with young people when her children were entering an age where there was nothing to keep them in their local church through their teenage years.

"St Keverne church is a very prayerful body of Christ and open to the Holy Spirit," explained Nina. However due to her concern over lack of activities for teenagers in St Keverne at the time, the family decided to try another church that offered more for young people for a month. Within weeks Nina says it was clear the family should stay at St Keverne and felt God say 'there isn't anything here so you need to do something about it'.

When it came to starting up something within the village Nina, along with Margaret another member of the congregation who was keen to work with young people, set up a youth club on a Friday night in the church hall. Nina said: "This was going to be a youth club put on by the church for the young people in the parish with no strings attached."

On the opening night back in 2004 they had about 40 young people come through the door and the numbers on the register have been maintained in the following 12 years.

Working with young people was not something Nina expected. "I am not a youth worker and had no training, but I have got a massive, massive heart for young people, and I find it very easy to be around young people especially talking to them about Jesus and sharing the Bible with them."



Working closely with other youth workers from nearby towns, in 2008 it was decided to start an event for young people to hear the Christian message called 'Fusion'. The event still runs monthly mainly for local young Christians although recently more non-Christian young people have come from surrounding areas. Other youth courses are also now run.

In 2013 the youth work was boosted when the PCC agreed to have a SWYM trainee and Mike arrived. Nina added: "Having Mike here is of huge importance."

As the result of doing youth work Nina says she has learnt a lot. "It is an absolute privilege to share Jesus and the truth and God's love with young people. It is a responsibility but there are blessings. My faith and knowledge of God has grown massively and learning how to teach – I love that side of it. Doing the Freedom in Christ course with them has taught me things about who I was in Christ that nobody had taught me.

"A lot is gained through youth work but a lot is given. For those who have the heart this takes a lot of time, preparation, commitment and prayer."


Or if you want it in six points, in an exercise I did a few years back with some ordinands, it is this: I believe:
