WOULD YOUR CHURCH INTERRUPT ITS AMBITION?

When London Marathon runner Matthew Rees stopped 200m from the finishing line to help struggling runner and stranger, David Wyeth, the world gasped. We watched as one runner helped another, replacing ambition and accolade with kindness and selflessness.

At the May Diocesan Synod, Simon Cade, Director of Education and Discipleship, asked how amazing would it be if love within our diocese was such that individual churches would interrupt their ambition to stop and carry a neighbouring church.

Simon was talking about how Synod leads for discipleship, and how decisions made at Synod can either encourage unity and interdependence, or permit the myth of independence and competition between churches.

Synod used five ideas to reflect on leadership for discipleship, among them the idea of unity and Jesus' advice that others would know us as disciples by our love for one another.

"Would your church stop in its tracks, put plans and training to one side, sacrifice the result you were expecting, pick up a neighbouring struggling church, carry it forward and help it to a better time?" he asked.

Simon talked about beginning with personal calling and vocation, which meant making worship the priority, taking sin seriously, and leading in ways that assume God will change us.

Abundance was the second idea, comparing our belief in a loving God who gives us more than we can ever need, with a global mindset that promotes the idea of scarcity. Synod was challenged to think about how we lead for one, rejecting the other.

Unity was the third idea, with the runners as the example, leading to the fourth idea which asked about how we lead for witness. The idea that brings these together is hope, and not just a vague optimism, but hope in the Resurrection. How can we lead in ways that have real courage, that are generous and overflowing with Resurrection love?

Synod imagined the diocese as a lifeboat in a storm. Members were asked to consider what sort of leadership would we need to show the courage to abandon the lifeboat and trust in God more than we trust in plans, budgets, or yesterday's achievements?

Leading for discipleship will be a theme for the diocese over the next few months with rural deans looking at the five ideas in June, and deaneries working on it in the autumn. Please pray for our leaders as they seek God's will and courage to run the race that is set before us.

- * During the Presidential Address, Bishop Tim asked whether we even listened to the words uttered by candidates during the General Election campaign, or had we already decided how to vote. "I urge you all to vote and exercise your duty as citizens and I urge you to consider how you vote through the lens of your faith," he said.
- * Peter Rand of Friends of the Holy Land reminded Synod that Christian churches there are being persecuted and in danger of extinction. He asked for prayer and support, especially as we try to imagine a Holy Land without Christianity.
- * Jonathan Rowe updated the Synod on ministry, focusing on the progress of AMD, the plans to develop it into a two-year programme, and an overview of ministry generally across the diocese.

FROM KEA TO KENYA TO HELP ORPHANED YOUNGSTERS

For Georgie Hallet, who is just weeks away from swapping Kea for Kenya, it was never an 'if' but a 'when' she was going to live and work asa missionary in Africa.

As she prepares to take on the role of Manager of the Marejesho Family Project in Kisumu, Kenya, Georgie's enthusiasm for the task ahead is enviable.

What started as a simple fostering project by two local women, Georgie hopes with support and guidance from her board of trustees in Kenya and the UK, it will restore dignity and stability to vulnerable children in Kisumu. The project believes children belong in families, and it has developed four projects to see this happen: family preservation, foster care support, family-style homes, and evangelism and discipleship.

It was not until three years later when she had completed her degree in International Education at Bath Spa University that Georgie returned to Africa and fate landed her in the town of Kisumu in Kenya.



I was really aware that there were lots of people wanting to help orphans in Africa but there was something missing. We wouldn't dream of putting a child in the UK into an orphanage yet it seems acceptable in Africa – why is this?
