This year's Diocesan Day of Prayer includes a widely varied programme (both contemplative and more 'active') for people of all ages, to enable us to go both deeper into prayer and wider into the world.

One prayer activity that will go on all day and have both a deeper and wider dimension will quite literally be about 'building' ... a Beach Labyrinth on Towan Beach (from 11am). It's intended to draw not only Prayer Day punters and families, but also those out and about enjoying the Newquay Fish Festival.

Andrew Nicholson, who's built and facilitated beach labyrinths all over the county, will be hosting this prayer activity. He says, "People have been creating and walking labyrinths for centuries. Beach Labyrinth is a new take on an ancient tradition ..."

"If you build it, they will come!"

During the Church of England's General Synod, which met in July, members to:

- * disinvest from fossil-fuel companies by 2023 unless they are on the path to tackling climate change according to the Paris Agreement restricting global average temperature to well below 2°C;

- * prepare a full analysis for carbon

accounting and environmental management programme costs for dioceses and present a case at February Synod (London and Truro Motion);

- * has passed a motion calling on the UK government to "respond positively" to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW), which was agreed by 122 states at the United Nations in July 2017.

The Revd Canon Robin Osborne, a former parish priest of St Mary's and St Paul's Penzance and a Canon Emeritus of Truro Cathedral, passed away at the end of May at a nursing home in Cheshire.

Fr Wynford Phillips, who lived in St Agnes, died in June, aged 103. Fr Phillips was Rector of Roche and of Withiel between 1973 – 1980 and Rural Dean of St Austell between 1976 – 1980. He retired in 1980 and held PTO in this diocese.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN AND FAMILIES IN RURAL CORNWALL

It's hard to imagine what it must feel like to be given an almost blank page as a Children and Family Worker across the North Cornwall Cluster. Exciting? Daunting? For Marcus Jones, it was a mixture of both.

"These are rural churches, so there is a fragility to engaging young people and families but when it works, it's very rewarding."

Marcus believes that the churches in the cluster have a heart to be more open and welcoming to all generations, "It's about being brave enough to travel through very low numbers in the belief that more numbers will come."

And coming they are. The number of young people engaged in church life has increased from zero to 12%, they offer more family and special services and recently Marcus was



really chuffed with a pet service at St Minver. "In many ways, a pet service is more inclusive than a family service! Everyone loves their pets and they are very bonding – as well as being great fun and a perfect talking point."

CHURCHES THREATENED BY CUTS & CLIMATE CHANGE

A big increase in the number of historic churches and chapels seeking funding for urgent repair, maintenance and development projects has been reported by the National Churches Trust in its annual review for 2017 - 2018, published in July. Figures show it received 480 applications for grants in 2017, an increase of 26% on 2016.
